Welcome back! We hope you have had a good Easter.

School uniform

We have been delighted to see how smart the children have been looking. Please ensure that you follow the school uniform policy and all items of uniform are labelled. Please ensure that your child comes to school with a cap, water bottle and sun cream during the hot weather.

PE

We have two PE sessions each week; Monday (Planet Soccer) and Wednesday (cricket). However, we do ask that all children have their PE kit in school every day in case of changes to the timetable. All children in Year 3 are encouraged to take their PE kit home so that it can be washed when needed.

Snacks & Water

Children may bring a healthy snack (fresh fruit or vegetables only) with them to eat at break times. Please do not send any nuts or kiwi fruit. We are also encouraging the children to drink plenty of water, so please ensure your child has a named bottle.

Pencil cases

The School provides all writing and stationery equipment needed. No pencil cases are needed at School but your child may bring a simple case if they want to.

Home learning

In Year 3 we will distribute Maths homework (Mymaths on Friday) and another piece (from English, Topic or Science) on Tuesday as well as a spelling list, which must be handed in on Monday (spelling tests will take place each Monday). All home learning is to be completed in the yellow homework book. An additional set of home learning tasks will be set by the class teacher and chosen by the student (one each half term) - please see sheet.

Reading

In Year 3 all children are expected to read at home every day for 20 minutes or more. We encourage all children to find books that they enjoy. Please try to find time to listen to your child read. In order to help them develop a love of reading, taking time to read to your child is equally important. Please ensure that they have a book to read in school with them each day along with a reading record for communication.

Parent help

There may be occasions when we would appreciate some additional help for practical activities or something special. If you are able to help on occasions, please do let Mr Kemp or Mr Bloomfield know.

Communication

If you would like to contact us, please advise the school office by email or telephone. We will then ensure that a convenient time to meet is arranged. We will always come and speak to you, or contact you by phone if we have any concerns about your child.
