<b>30 minutes</b>	<b>MATHS</b>	Race to 20' game: You need 1 dice, 2 counters/stones/ car to move along the track, a number track to 20. Make a number track to 20 on some paper or with chalk if you want to play it outside. Player 1 rolls the dice and moves their 'counter' along the track the correct number of moves. Player 2 repeats and so on to see who is the first to reach 20. You could add some rules for finishing such as, you have to get the correct number on the dice to finish on 20 rather than going beyond 20. Perhaps repeat with numbers to 30?

Can you read these sentences (adult to write on piece of paper) - <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A pair of cats sat on the stairs.</li> <li>• I see a chair at the airport.</li> </ul> Can you write your own sentence with the air sound?
<b>20 minutes</b>	<b>COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE</b>	Talk about party invitations and what you need to have written on them. Have a go at writing a party invitation to a friend/family/soft toy to come to the 'party' you have set up or would like to have. What kind of party is it? Where? When? Will you dress up? Write it like a letter with 'Dear...' and 'From .....' (also decorate your invite).
