School Uniform and PE

We have been delighted that the children continue to look smart. Please ensure that you follow the school uniform policy (including hair accessories) and all items of uniform are labelled. PE sessions continue to be on Thursday and Friday. Please ensure all kit is labelled and is in school daily in case of changes to the timetable.

Fruit and water

Children need to stay hydrated, so please ensure they have a named water bottle in school. They may bring in fresh (not dried) fruit or vegetables to eat at break times – no nuts.

Home learning

Reading: Children should read daily for at least 20 minutes and be encouraged to read books they enjoy, but also attempt different genres and authors. Children have opportunity to choose a book from our school library on Wednesday as well as selecting books from the classroom. We would encourage you to continue to take time out to read with or to your children, so they enjoy stories and learn to love reading throughout their life.

Multiplication Tables: Please practise quick recall of multiplication tables, including Times Table Rock Stars. Your child should have a log in for this. We will be taking part in the optional multiplication times-tables check in June. More details to follow.
